Liberty of Conscience for All

Secretary General Remarks

The first of all freedoms is Liberty of conscience. Liberty of conscience means the right to arrive at one's private beliefs without being coerced into an artificial unity by those who wield power over us.

It is a natural right given to man by the divine. The most primary of all human duties is the right to say Yes or No to the gift of existence and all that it entails. All other liberties originate from this primordial right. When this right is denied, it immediately places man in conflict

AARLA recognizes any form of denial of this right by families, communities, governments of faiths as the number one reason for conflicts of all forms in Africa. For Africans to coexist in peace, the value of liberty of conscience cannot be overemphasized. AARLA upholds prevention of conflicts to resolving conflicts as key to peaceful coexistence

The theme of the 4th All Africa Liberty of Conscience Congress is:

"Peaceful coexistence in Africa: The Undeniable Value of Liberty of Conscience"

This congress has attracted speakers of experience on matters of peace and conflict resolution, at the global, Continental, regional, community and family levels It offers short presentations from invited speakers both at the plenary and break-out sessions and accords participants sufficient time for questions and answers and enriching comments in a very interactive atmosphere

The right to freedom of conscience is recognized by several international conventions, such as the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the African charter on Human and Peoples' Rights (Banjul Charter).

AARLA is an independent association historically associated with International religious liberty association which Is the oldest religious liberty association in the world. For 130 years the International Religious Liberty Association has worked to promote freedom of conscience for every person, no matter who they are or where they live in the world. Currently, we are actively or partially present in all countries in Africa.

We promote the freedom to believe, or not to believe, as defined by Article 18 of the **Universal Declaration of Human Rights**

"Everyone has the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion; this right includes freedom to change his religion or belief, and freedom, either alone or in community with others and in public or private, to manifest his religion or belief in teaching, practice, worship and observance."

And Article 8 of the African charter on Human and Peoples' Rights (Banjul Charter).

"Freedom of Conscience, the profession and free practice of religion shall be guaranteed. No one may, subject to law and order, be submitted to measures restricting the exercise of these freedoms".

We believe religious freedom is a foundational human right, which is intimately connected with all other human rights.

We believe that the freedom to believe, or not to believe, is not a favor that governments can bestow. It is a universal, God-given freedom that flows from the innate dignity of every human being.

We hold symposiums, conferences, and events around the continent focused on the scholarly community, the religious freedom advocacy community, religious leaders of many different faiths, and those who hold public office.

Every five years AARLA organizes a continental Congress on Religious Freedom to bring together academics, practitioners and activists in the religious liberty cause from all over the continent. This is the 4th edition of the All Africa Congress on Religious Liberty

We also sponsor large-scale popular events around the continent , such as Religious Freedom Festivals and other rallies. Through these, we aim to raise public awareness of religious freedom issues.

Our team is invited every year to give lectures at universities and churches, to write articles, and to give interviews on radio and television.

The AARLA does not identify with any political party, nor does it endorse any candidates for political office. The IRLA is overseen by a Board of Directors.

It has no paid staff; officers and directors serve voluntarily. Funding for IRLA operations comes from organizations supportive of the association's purpose.

The IRLA is incorporated as not-for-profit organization in the Republic of Kenya. Originally organized by the Seventh-day Adventist Church, the AARLA's purpose is the continental and non-sectarian promotion of religious

freedom for all people, everywhere. Membership is open to all religions and organizations, individuals of similar vision and mission

At AARLA, we believe in prevention of conflicts though respect for liberty of Conscience of persons, communities, faiths and nations.
